Youth of the Year contests are designed to recognize top achievers.





More information about Youth Contests

Youth of the Year contests consist of four parts: a written exam, an oral presentation, a judging contest, and a horsemanship pattern. Each section of the contest is worth approximately 250 points. Many contests offer divisions for leadline, walk-trot, and junior aged exhibitors. Expectations for these divisions are modified to be appropriate for the age of the contestants. Please contact your local contest organizer for more information on the divisions being offered at your local contest.

Youth who win the Senior division or who score over 800 points in the Senior division at local contests qualify to compete for AMHA Youth of the Year at the Grand National & World Championship Morgan Horse Show® in Oklahoma City.

The winner of this prestigious title receives a unique prize package customized by the winner valued at \$3,500. The reserve winner receives a unique prize package customized by the reserve winner valued at \$1,500. These prize packages are sponsored by the Cynthia Elaine Epperson Trust. In addition, the winner and reserve winner receive educational scholarships donated by the Kohler family—\$5,000 to the winner and \$2,500 to the reserve winner.

Local and regional contests are open to youth of all ages, but only those aged 14 years and older can qualify to compete in Oklahoma.

With youth members in the United States, Canada, and all over the world, AMHAY offers a variety of programs that challenge members to become involved, to learn, and to develop competence in all areas of the horse industry.

The Morgan youth program is designed to bring out the best in its members—no matter their skills or interests. Owning a Morgan horse is not a requirement for membership. Membership in AMHA Youth is open to all young people under 21.

### **MERIT PROGRAM**



The AMHAY Merit Program is designed to help you become a competent horse person. The six successive levels of testing are designed to increase knowledge of the Morgan breed and general horsemanship while receiving recognition for hard work.

## Levels of the AMHA Merit Program:

**FIGURE BADGE:** Introductory level. FOR NON-MEMBERS ONLY. Youth receives a FREE youth AMHA Membership for the remainder of the year upon completion.

**BULRUSH:** Award includes certificate, gift card, and Bulrush pin.

**WOODBURY:** Award includes certificate, gift card, and Woodbury pin.

SHERMAN: Award includes certificate, gift card, and Sherman pin.

**BLACK HAWK:** Award includes certificate, gift card, and Black Hawk pin.

**JUSTIN MORGAN:** The highest of badge achievements. Award includes certificate, gift card, Justin Morgan pin, custom AMHA jacket, and recognition on the AMHA website.

The AMHA Youth Teams Program is an annual competition designed to facilitate teamwork and good sportsmanship throughout barns and horse friends, while helping to educate and familiarize youth with the Morgan horse.





## Are you interested in equitation? Do you strive to do the best you can?

Excellence in equitation is valued by the American Morgan Horse Association and is recognized through the AMHA Medal Classes, held at local and regional Morgan and all-breed shows. All junior riders who are AMHA members are invited to compete on a Morgan. AMHA Silver Medals are awarded in each of the six seats: Saddle Seat, Western Seat, Hunt Seat on the Flat, Hunt Seat Over Fences, Reining Seat, and Dressage Seat.

Those who place first and second in an AMHA Silver Medal Class are qualified to participate in the Gold Medal Finals at the Grand National. Gold Medals are the highest AMHA equitation honor and are awarded, along with scholarships, in each of the six seats.
