

The National Morgan Horse Show has become one of the most outstanding all-breed shows in this country. It has grown from a Show organized by Mr. Owen Moon in 1939 to celebrate the 150th Anniversary of the birth of the foundation sire Justin Morgan. That show was staged on one of Mr. Moon's farms at his summer home in South Woodstock, Vermont. The Show was held in connection with the festivities of the Green Mountain Horse Association at the close of their 100 Mile Trail Ride of that year, an organization and event of which Mr. Moon was a founder.

The Show in 1939 brought together about 100 Morgans which were exhibited in 18 classes. It marked the end of a period of nearly thirty years of hard times for the Morgan breed and initiated a new era for the breed. This year's show will bring together over 250 of the finest Morgans in the eastern part of the United States. They will be shown in 65 classes, over a three-day period. This development is significant in that it shows the tremendous upsurge of interest in the Morgan breed during this period.

Mr. Moon was a Director and officer of The Morgan Horse Club, Inc., for many years and with Mrs. Moon's loyal support made their place in South Woodstock a rallying place for Morgan activities at a turning point in the breed's history. It is fitting that a review of Mr. Moon's activities in behalf of the Morgan Horse should be made a part of the Program of this great Show.

Mrs. Moon, with the assistance of L. L. Mounce, long time manager of Upwey Farms, has kindly written the following interesting outline of the Moons' Morgan activities while carrying on their famous Upwey Farms.

In 1909, Mr. and Mrs. Owen Moon, Jr., came to Woodstock, Vt. from Trenton, N. J. to establish a summer home. They bought the "Kendall place" at South Woodstock. Because the country-side reminded them of scenery in England, they named it "Upwey Farms." Upwey, England, the headwaters of the Wey river, was the former home of Mrs. Moon's ancestors who came to America in 1680.

Upway Farms expanded through the years with the addition of ten adjoining properties some of which were practically abandoned farms. The new owners were keenly interested in improving and restoring these properties. They were kept busy with projects in construction, land-scaping and reclaiming the land and stocking the farms with animals of the highest quality.

For many generations this section had been famous for its sheep, its Jersey cows and its Morgan horses. No one interest could absorb their energies and ambitions, thus it followed that many breeds of animals, field crops, orchards, reforestation and pasture improvement claimed attention. The growth and betterment of community life and social and business progress was their constant desire.

One of the farms was stocked with Suffolk sheep imported from England. These produced breeding animals that went to found new flocks or to improve those that were long established. Large classes were sent for exhibit at local shows and at the International. They brought home the ribbons.

The dairy herd sometimes numbered over two hundred Jerseys including the National butterfat champion and several of her sisters with high records. With herd sires whose production record inheritance was unmatched, the offspring met the demands of progressive Jersey breeders. They were sought as additions to many well known herds where they brought satisfaction and made high production records. At Upwey Farms all producers were kept on test and many pedigrees showed line-breeding to the highest of production capacity.

Before tractors and trucks were efficient for use on hill farms, good draft horses were necessary. Mr. Moon being familiar with the Suffolk Punch draft horse so prized in the East of England, realized they possessed the qualities most wanted by Vermont farmers. In 1914 several mares and a stallion were brought to Upwey Farms. At that time a large number of colts were being raised in the county and for several seasons this stallion was in demand. In following years importations from England along with the annual colt crop at Upwey, built up the numbers so that

this was the largest stable of Suffolks in the country. Through showing and with national advertising a wide market was established and auction sales of thirty or forty head brought buyers from long distances.

Teams weighing over forty hundred pounds had the power and were handy and quick. Though the draft horse has been replaced by the use of tractors and trucks, at that time the Suffolk Punch at Upwey proved his worth and accomplished what could not have been done otherwise.

Along with these and many other interests, Mr. Moon loved a good saddle horse and spent many happy hours riding. He found great joy in raising livestock and the new colts each season were his special delight. The Morgans gave him the greatest pleasure. He had true appreciation of the breed; he knew their peculiar fitness for use by the rugged pioneers in this hilly country and also their unmatched qualities as pleasure horses in these later days. He considered them unsurpassed for intelligence, good feet and legs, courage and stamina and long life.

Throughout the twenties and early thirties, Morgan interest had dwindled; registrations at the Club office were at an all time low. Too much credit can scarcely be given to the few breeders who were able to preserve small bands of Morgans of the purest strains. Hundreds of old time breeders had turned the colts to pasture with the sheep and had lost all records on them. Mr. Moon ran advertisements in local papers throughout the state and he drove hundreds of miles to search out and rescue good mares thus located.

He had some mares of local breeding for several years then in 1915 he bought the stallion Tarik 7202 who was foaled in 1907, of Black Hawk blood, bred by Dr. Hiniman of Dundee, Ill. Upwey Prince Tarik 7816 followed. Among his get is Upwey Princess, winner of the Hundred Mile Trail Hide in 1939. Many others of his get appear in show-rings today. Upwey Prince Tarik was followed by Upwey Ben Scott, a son of Bennington out of the grand old mare Klyona. The latter produced eight foals by various sires at Upwey.

At times three or four stallions were kept and also mares were sent to the U. S. Morgan Farms for breeding to Bennington, Mansfield and others.

The brood mares were daughters of Sir Ethan Allen, Gen. Gates, Scotland, Troubadour, Bennington, Mansfield, Jubilee King and more than a dozen other famous horses. Colts from these matings were in good demand and many found new homes in far places. Some stallions went to the Remount Service and were placed in Florida, Montana and

A. H. S. A. Rules for Morgan Classes

The following rules taken from the American Horse Show Association Rule Book, apply to all of the breed and conformation classes and to most of the performance classes.

Rule XXVI — Morgan Horse Division

Part 1. General Qualifications.

Sec. 1. Entries must be serviceably sound and in good condition. To wear natural unbraided mane and natural unset tail. All horses shown in this division are to be registered with The Morgan Horse Club, Inc.

Sec. 2. Horses shall be shown at all gaits both ways of the ring. Stripping of horses to judge for type and conformation is optional in other performance classes but

mandatory in championship classes.

Sec. 3. Morgan type and conformation: A Morgan is distinctive for its stamina and vigor for its size, personality and eagerness and strong, natural way of moving. The head is made up of a straight or slightly dished face; big prominent eyes set wide apart; small ears set rather wide apart, carried alertly; small muzzle with firm lips and large nostrils. prominent jaw. In body conformation the Morgan gives the appearance of a very strong, powerful horse with great shoulder angulation and depth, short back, broad loins, muscular and well developed croup, and with tail set in high and carried gracefully. Head is carried proudly and neck slightly crested, meeting the head at a well defined throttle. Legs are straight and sound with short cannons, flat bone, medium length pasterns and an appearance of over-all substance. The Morgan ranges from 14.1 to 15.1 hands with occasional entries over or under.

Part II. Breeding Classes.

Sec. 1 Horses shall enter the ring and be lined up at the discretion of judge. Entries are to be judged individually, standing and then at a walk and trot on the line.

Horses should stand squarely on all four feet. Emphasis shall be on type and conformation.

Sec. 2. Only two persons shall be allowed in the ring to show each horse in breeding classes.

Part III. Performance Classes.

Sec. 1. Qualifying gaits:

- (a) Walk: Flat-footed, rapid, elastic, showy.
- (b) Trot: Square, collected and balanced.
- (c) Canter: Smooth, collected, and straight on both leads.

Sec. 2. Suitability of the horse and its action for the type of job at hand is essential. High *natural* action is desired in three-gaited and harness classes; easy, ground-covering action in pleasure and hack events.

Sec. 3. Appointments shall be such as are appropriate for horses shown under similar circumstances in other saddle divisions. Quarter boots and other artificial appliances are prohibited except in roadster classes, where quarter boots are permissible. English or Western tack to be specified in the prize list for performance classes.

Part IV. Class Specifications.

Sec. 1. Entries in the Morgan Division are judged on some of the following qualifications:

Performance Quality Type Presence Conformation Manners

Sec. 2 In performance classes entries shall be judged 60% on performance and manners and 40% on type and conformation. In breeding classes, emphasis shall be placed upon type and conformation, with consideration given to a horse's ability to move correctly on the lead.

HISTORY OF THE MORGAN HORSE

In 1789 the quiet-spoken schoolmaster, Justin Morgan, despairing of ever making a proper living in his location near Springfield, Massachusetts, decided in favor of a move to Vermont. At 42, Mr. Morgan owned little in the way of worldly goods, but he did have a colt; small, plain bay in color, a colt he would gladly have sold but for the fact that his unprepossessing looks and lack of proper size and weight made a sale impossible. Named Figure, little proof has ever been unearthed as to the colt's ancestry, whether he was, as most people believe by the near-Thoroughbred horse True Briton out of a predominantly Arabian mare, or whether he was a Dutch horse, that small, thick-set breed of horse having its origin in Holland and imported in small numbers to the American colonies. It is of small importance since Figure, later known by the name of is first owner, Justin Morgan, was one of these breeding rarities, a stallion whose every foal was marked in his image. Justin Morgan's antecedents remain shrouded in some mystery, but his descendents, even some hundred and sixty years later, have been welded into a breed whose fame as general purpose horses remains as strong, perhaps even stronger, than it was over a cen-

Justin Morgan was not a large horse, and during a lifetime of almost thirty years of adversity and drudgery, rarely weighed over a thousand pounds. He was a solid dark bay, with a thick, wavey black mane and tail. A most compact horse, he had the short back, rounded body and powerful quarters needed for the heavy work he did, but he was completely free of the coarseness that would have indicated draft blood. Not much over fourteen hands when actually measured, he belied that lack of height with his high head carriage and rapid, "going places" gaits. Although he did not have exceedingly high action, his gaits were square and even, for he never wore a corrective shoe and, indeed, went barefoot most of his life. He was short-legged and undeniably without any outward appearance of the Thoroughbred as we know him today. Yet he had their great courage and will to win in the fullest measure, for it was that attribute that made possible his almost legendary accomplishments. He out-ran, out trotted and out-pulled the horses and teams he was matched against in Vermont and New Hampshire, and he did so each time with a gaiety of manner that made light of every effort and endeared him to all who were privileged to have known him. There are many legends about the old Morgan, from the time he out-pulled the double hitch of draft horses to the time he carried the President in a certain muster day parade. He was the kind of horse about which legends grow, but none of them were stranger than the real-life success that little horse without a pedigree made in establishing America's oldest breed of horse.

Bred to Vermont mares, most of which were of completely unproven ancestry, Justin Morgan left many fine colts, some three of which were of such excellence that they founded families of their own . . . the Woodburys, the Shermans, and the Bulrushes. Ensuing generations of Morgans gained materially in size, largely because the selection for greater height filled the market demands of that day. The very earliest Morgans were in general used on the farms in northern New England. The little horse that ploughed the garden on weekdays was given a hasty currying and took the family to church in a top buggy on Sunday. After 1820, the urge for speed tightened its grip on America and there was an increasing demand for smart roadsters, those that could hold their own in a brush with the fleet, grey Messenger. Justin Morgan's grandson Black Hawk and his great-grandson Ethan Allen became by-words, and the latter's famous race with Dexter, the one in which he became the fastest trotting stallion in the world, received greater newspaper acclaim in that year of 1867 than did the words of the President of the United States.

Long before that date, Morgan stallions and mares had begun the countrywide migration which was to make this oldest of American breeds the watchword for equine quality throughout the country. By 1870 there were Morgans in every state and section. Blood's Black Hawk was taken to Kentucky where his descendents did much to further the breeding of the American Saddle Horse and later, the Tennessee Walking Horse. Keokuk and Black Eagle went to California even before the forty-niners, and Oregon stock breeders had the use of Vermont and Wisconsin was a way Pathfinder. station for men and horses on their way to the gold fields, and many remained there rather than face the rigors of the Rock Mountains in Winter. Among these were Coman's Gray Eagle and Black Flying Cloud. Many Iowa and Ohio breeders knew Morgans from their earliest days and they chose Panic, General Stark and StockBridge Chief. Ben Franklin in Tennessee, Walker Morrill in Virginia and Black Prince in Maryland, all did their part to popularize the new breed.

The American craze for sheer speed, to the complete expense of the virtues of soundness and good sense, very nearly proved the undoing of the Morgan horse, whose numbers were few indeed at the close of the nineteenth century. At this time the breed enjoyed a temporary rise in popularity with the advent of roadster classes in the leading horse shows. Here the Morgans easily led the field, with their compact good looks, their square gaits and an inbred ability to "turn it on" when the reinman spoke.. The incomparable Lady de Jarnette compiled a record of wins that led to her early banishment from competition because so few exhibitors could be found to vie only for red ribbons. At the fabulous World's Fair in St. Louis, a pair of Morgans won over all comers in the pairs in harness class. Following that showing, one of the team was sold (for a reputed \$10,000) to be sent abroad.

That blaze of popularity seemed all too short however, for it soon became evident that rail travel, the steamship and later the automobile would make the driving horse a thing of the past. This end was averted only through the untiring efforts of a few breeders who later founded the present Morgan Horse Club. With a helping hand from the United States Department of Agriculture, which maintained a large breeding farm in Vermont and which helped materially to foster breed interest in a number of state universities, the Morgan Horse Club has succeeded wonderfully in its efforts to again raise the Morgan Horse to the great height he once occupied in a horse-minded public's esteem.

Today, although bred primarily for saddle uses, our Morgan horse, which gave so largely to the establishment of every other American breed, has withal maintained its own identity and may be found in greatly increasing numbers. You can find one as the cherished "million dollar horse" that belongs to some small boy or girl, on the largest working cattle ranches in California or Kansas, on competitive trail rides from Vermont to Florida, where the best he always gives usually wins for him the top awards. Morgans exce as family horses, show horses, chil ren's hunters and roadsters. Whater a good horse can do, a Morgan try. The oldest true American he he is a huge success at what he is to be, our geatest pleasure horse.

The President's Message

To the Members of The Morgan Horse Club:

A canvass is now being made to secure a person capable of carrying on the registry work and act as a promotional manager. A sincere vote of thanks should be given Mr. Stone for his interest and generosity. Without his assistance during the low ebb I do not beieve we would have been able to carry on.

The fourth annual Morgan Horse Club field day and judging seminar was held at the new home of Mr. and Mrs. Roger Ela of Bolton, Massachusetts. Much credit should be given the Elas for the excellent program they arranged. Each year I believe the breeders and judges are coming to have a better understanding of the ideal Morgan. Qualified judges are still a problem with us, but progress is being made. More judging seminars in other parts of the country is in the plans for the future.

Nearly all the local clubs are now having their own 'ALL-MOR-GAN" shows. My congratulations to them and best wishes for the future. Some day we may be able to hold a national Morgan show made up of champions from all the local "ALL-MORGAN" shows throughout the country.

I would like to remind all members that the model Morgan horse trophies can be puchased direct from The L. G. Balfour Company, Attleboro, Massachusetts. The decalcomanias for cars, trailers and trucks can be purchased direct from The Vermont Art Studio, Pittsford, Vermont. I would like to see more decals and models on members' cars.

I am sure we all agree Mr. Eusey is doing a wonderful job with the Morgan Magazine, but we must have more subscribers and more advertising, especially now that we soon will be on our own financially.

Plans are being made for an even bigger and better NATIONAL MORGAN HORSE SHOW which will again be held in Northampton, Massachusetts, July 26th, 27th, and 28th. I hope that every member of the Morgan Horse Club can attend this event and see the progress that has been made in the quality and uniformity of the Morgans exhibited. It will also give you an opportunity to become better acquainted with the Morgan breeders — a grand group of people.

This year we have changed our social schedule somewhat. We are starting with a buffet supper Thursday evening, July 25th, at 6:00 o'clock at the Northampton Hotel. Immediately following the buffet we are holding our annual meeting. Only members who have paid their dues for this year will be eligible to attend. Our informal social get-together with music and dancing will follow the annual meeting. The Sunday morning breakfast on the grounds was a huge success and will be repeated this year. A new venture will be an "After-Show" box lunch party held in the same building where we have our Sunday breakfast. It is felt that many exhibitors will welcome the opportunity to secure something to eat before shipping home. To those who do not have to hurry home, it will give us an occasion to sit, chat and relax. It will be necessary to secure reservations for the three events from Seth Armen, National Morgan Horse Show Manager.

I wish it were possible for me to thank every one personally for the hospitality, cooperatiton and assistance yo have given me. I especially want to thank the presidents and secretaries of all local clubs for keeping me informed of their progress, and a great big "THANK YOU" to all club editors for sending the news of their club activities to the magazine. You have done a tremendous job. Keep up the good work.

15th Annual National Morgan Horse Show

The first National Morgan Horse Show was held in 1939, and celebrated the 150th anniversary of the birth of the foundation stallion of the breed, JUSTIN MORGAN. From 1939 through 1942 the show was conducted at Upwey Farms, South Woodstock, Vt., under the guidance of the late Mr. Owen Moon. These early shows were co-sponsored by the Morgan Horse Club, Inc., and the Green Mountain Horse Association, and followed the completion of the Vermont 100-mile trail ride. In all, about 15 classes were crowded into the single half-day session.

World War II prevented shows being held from 1943 to 1946. In 1947 the show was resumed, but moved from South Woodstock, to Wind-Crest Farm of Mr. and Mrs. F. O. Davis at Windsor, Vermont. Repeat performances were held during 1948 and 1949. In 1950 the show moved to a new location in Windsor on the Connecticut River, and continued here through 1951.

In 1952 the show moved to its present site at Northampton, Mass. Each show has increased in size over the years, from 15 classes and a few dozen entries in the first shows to 69 classes and over 260 entries in this 15th Anual National Morgan Horse Show. The usual show many of you have attended in your community includes saddle classes for three and five-gaited Saddle Horses, jumping classes for Hunters and Jumpers, fine-harness classes for Gaited Horses, roadster classes for Standardbreds, western classes for Palominos and Quarterhorses and hack and trail classes for Pleasure Horses. The distinction of this show lies in the fact that one breed, the Morgan Horse, puts on all the variety of the usual show, with a few wrinkles seen only in an all Morgan Horse Show. To qualify as entries, all horses

must be purebred and registered in the name of the exhibitor in the American Horse Register, maintained by the Morgan Horse Club, Inc. All Morgans are shown with natural mane and natural unset tail.

The classes in this show concern both breed and performance classes. The requirements followed by judge and exhibitors alike for each class are stated throughout the program. The infomation now presented may add to your pleasure in following the show.

BREED CLASSES

In beed classes, horses are to enter the ring and be lined up. They may then be moved at the discretion of the judge and ringmaster. Each horse will be judged on type and conformation and natural action, if moved.

PERFORMANCE CLASSES

In performance classes, horses are to be judged 40% on type and conformation with the remaining 60% to be distributed among one or more of the following: performance, quality, manners, presence and suitability. The order of precedence in each class indicates the emphasis used in judging that particular class.

Type and Conformation. A type is an ideal or standard of perfection combining all the characters which contribute to the animal's value and efficiency for the purpose specified. Conformation is a comparison of an animal to the ideal or standard. A horse with good conformation closely resembles the standard of perfection for his particular breed. Soundness is almost always considered with conformation and refers to a horse without defects. A serviceably sound horse is one whose defects do not interfere with his ability to perform. Soundness is generally accepted as applying to the legs of a

horse, but may include defects of any part of his body. All horses exhibited in this show are to be serviceably sound.

Performance. Performance, as the word implies, means how the horse performs in the ring at all required gaits. Especially considered here is action. High natural action is desired in three-gaited and harness classes; easy, ground-covering action in pleasure and hack events.

Manners. Manners in the show ring mean an energetic yet manageable disposition, showing evidence of superior training and obedience.

Presence. Presence usually considered with manners, means alertness and animation on the part of the horse. Presence in the horse is comparable to personality in the human.

Quality. Quality is denoted by clean, flat bone; well-defined joints and tendons; refined head and neck; and fine skin and hair. Good quality in a horse generally indicates easy keeping and good endurance.

Suitability. A horse's conformation and ability should fit him well for the task he is expected to perform. A child's horse and ladies' horse especcially should be suitable for their respective handlers.

Division High Score Awards are made based upon a tabulation of points as earned at recognized shows and since the National Morgan Horse Show is classified by the American Horse Shows Association as an "A" Show in the Morgan Division and exhbitors will receive triple points toward annual AHSA High Score Award. To be eligible for an award a horse must be recorded with the American Horse Shows Association and its owner an individual Association member in good standing.

For those interested in the rules which govern the showing of Morgans, consult the current issue of the American Horse Show Association Rule Book under the Morgan Division.

scattered among other stations. Several were sold for export to South America. Many are in use today in the East and it is seldom that the entry lists of large shows do not include some Upwey breeding. Readers of current reports know of the championships won by Upwey King Ben, Upwey Ben Don and Upwey Ben Quietude and the numerous and recurring winnings of their stable mates.

The countryside for many miles around Upwey is ideal for the saddle-horse and a joy to the rider. The trails on old wood-roads and abandoned highways where stagecoaches travelled a hundred years ago, offer the best of footing and are nearly always free from flies and pests. The wooded hills and fertile valleys offer pleasant prospects with clear running streams by the wayside and long views from the hill-tops. Mr. Moon wanted to share these pleasures wih other horse lovers, at the same time he realized the benefits that might come to the quiet village and local tavern if he could make this the mecca for riders. He has succeeded to an extent he could scarcely have visualized. The Green Mt. Horse Assoc. has established its headquarters nearby, consisting of large stable space, office, cookhouse and other facilities along with show-rings. Here are held the ceremonies at the finish of the Trail Ride and horse clubs gather for seasonal pleasure rides and competitions.

The town horse population has grown, some well known Morgan breeding establishments have recently located here. Many new residents have come to this section because of the Morgan interest although some have brought horses of other breeds.

The idea of the Hundred Mile Trail Ride stemmed from his interest in the old Army Remount Endurance Rides. Mr. Moon loved contests and realized these attractions were newsworthy and the publicity valuable advertising. In cooperation with the Green Mt. Horse Assoc. and especially with the help of Dr. Earle Johnson, the first ride was held in 1936. In this contest and in each annual event Morgans have placed well in competition with all breeds. The ride has become so popular that the only limit to extensive growth has been the overcrowding of facilities. Through the years thousands of horses have entered and a few hardy riders have joined in it a dozen or more times. Dr. Johnson continues to bear the burden of oversight of the complicated details and is always the genial host. This

Trail Ride has been used as a model for numerous rides now held in other sections.

The Morgan Horse Show was started in order to add attraction to the ceremonies at the finish of the Trail Ride and to bring Morgans to the attention of the public. For the first show considerable effort was made to induce a few breeders to exhibit. Later the entry lists were well filled and by 1939 there was great enthusiasm among a hundred exhibitors and three thousand spectators who crowded the "Oval" at Upwey. This was the beginning of the National Morgan Horse Show. It is serving a great purpose in advancing the Morgan breed.

A newspaper man, owner and publisher, Mr. Moon believed in advertising; he had a flair for publicity which in a large measure contributed to the rapid spread of Morgan enthusiasm. About 1940 he produced, printed in local shops and distributed the Morgan Horse Magazine which he continued to do for several years at his personal expense and practically singlehanded. The first issues were sent to a small list of Morgan people. Across the country other publications commented upon it and often quoted from it. Soon letters were received from all sections where Morgans were owned or appreciated; sometimes a message from some far corner of the nation would tell of the memories still cherished of the wonderful Morgans that grandfather owned. Perhaps more than any other instrument, this magazine, circulating from Coast to Coast, has stimulated interest in the Morgan horse and serves as a medium to bind together the clan of Morgan horse lovers.

The many projects promoted at Upwey Farms often became subjects for Sunday Supplements or for feature articles in city papers and leading magazines. In most of these the Morgans were featured and often pictured. In "The National Geographic" an article titled "The Long River of New England," by Albert W. Atwood, Upwey Farms was shown as host to the Green Mt. Horse Assoc. and the Trail Riders and there were pictures of the Morgan show featuring the judging of the mares and foals.

The success of these endeavors is a living memorial to a man who fostered all that would benefit the Morgan breed. Today Upwey Farms no longer exists as a country estate and many of the interesting and beneficial projects carried on there in the past years have become only fond memories, but so long as The Morgan Horse Show exists, the Magazine is read and men continue to breed and love the Morgan Horse, Owen Moon can never be forgotten.
