

Aming her a Top 20 Broodmare, "With only four foals recorded, Gertie G...appears very much a maiden compared to the other broodmares, but she should be mentioned as three of the four are well-known. Miller's Pride, by Woodland Chief, is a personable stallion and has produced some good colts. Miller's Admiral, by Upwey Ben Don, has really been a big winner for her, especially in harness; and again, his full sister, Miller's Adel, is carrying on successfully at the shows." – Marilyn Childs, "The All-Important Feminine Side," *The Morgan Horse*, January/February 1956, p34.

John Lydon remembered Gertie G, saying, "I looked out and there was an old brown mare standing there, thin as all get out, and I said to Mr. Miller, 'What mare is that?' He told me it was Gertie G, Adel's dam. I said, 'How much will you take for her?' He said, 'Well, seeing you bought the mare [Miller's Adel], you can have her." Well, we took them both, and as soon as we got home, we started to put some good feed into the old Gertie G mare, and she came around pretty good. Then, that winter, she picked up a bug and started to cough something awful. We thought we were going to lose her, so we had a man around the clock for seven or eight days steaming her head out and we saved her. We bred her to Wind-Crest Donfield four times, but the cross didn't produce the kind of horse I wanted. I was trying to convince Mrs. Power to breed her to Nocturne, but [Gertie G] died before we were able to get the job done." – "A Conversation with John Lydon" by Art Perry, *The Morgan Horse*, September 1984, page 99.

Gertie G's impact on the Morgan breed can be demonstrated by her grandson, Waseeka's In Command (Waseeka's Nocturne x Miller's Adel), one of the most influential Morgan sires of the second half of the twentieth century and behind almost all world champion Morgan show horses today. Descendants can be found in Canada, France, Great Britain, and the USA. ■
