

iz Taylor was an example of impeccable Western Working breeding. She was purchased as one of a herd of eight mares (with a four-month-old filly at her side) by AMHA Board President "Ted" Davis to cross on Upwey Ben Don to add bone and muscle to his action. She more than repaid his investment. Of her foals sired by Ben Don, Windcrest Play Girl (Patty Davis Ferguson's personal mount) won many endurance ride victories and was shown as a roadster at the New England Morgan Show (in between producing seven foals). Windcrest Play Boy (who left 58 registered progeny) was Grand Champion Morgan at the first Gold Cup. Windcrest Major was Grand Champion Gelding at the 1972 Michigan Spring Horse Show. Windcrest Benn Beau won in both ladies park harness with owner Dot White and park harness

pairs with trainer Dr. Bob Orcutt, and was one of the Morgans to represent the breed at the 1967 World's Fair in Montreal. Alezan Benn Adhem was Grand Champion Gelding at both the Eastern National and Mid-Atlantic shows in 1967. The park stallion Alezan Chieftain, by Pecos, sired more than 100 progeny in Michigan, mostly fillies. Lizzie McClure, by Otto McClure, shown lightly, "picked up her share of ribbons in English pleasure" (Moises Roizen, "F. O. 'Ted' Davis and the California Connection— Conclusion," *The Morgan* Horse, December 1987, pp. 243–244) while producing seven registered foals.

Liz Taylor's kind and willing descendants (sport horses, show horses, and family horses) may be found in Canada, France, Germany, Great Britain, and the United States.
