- 3. Level requirements do not need to be completed at the same time, although you must complete one level before progressing to the next.
- 4. Complete the checklist at the end of this packet and email to Nicole@morganhorse.com
- 5. Members may work on the merit levels as individuals or in a youth Team. The first two levels may be completed with any horse, but third level and above needs to be completed with a Morgan Horse.

INTRODUCTION

In this level of the Merit Program, you will be expected to demonstrate many skills and levels of Horsemanship, as well as document your experiences in the many facets of the equine industry. You will also be expected to contribute to your community by performing hours of community service.

The documentation of completion of this level will be in many forms. You will be required to video tasks, write essays, take photographs, and supply paperwork from places that you will be completing some of your requirements.

The first step to completing this level is to submit the application in the packet and send it to nicole@morganhorse.com.

You will also be required to sign all of the press release forms in this packet and send in with your application. This will allow AMHA to use the documentation in media and education related to our Merit Program.

Once your application is approved, you can then move on to complete the four phases of this level that include:

- Horsemanship
- Experiences/Internships/Exposures
- Tasks
- Community Service

1: HORSEMANSHIP

In this phase you will complete four mandatory tasks in addition to five tasks of your choice from the provided list.

The following tasks MUST be completed and documented in video to be submitted:

- Tack up a horse in a bitting rig.
- Lunge a horse in a bitting rig.
- Demonstrate bitting a horse in a stall.
- Long Line a horse.

Please complete five tasks on the following list of your choice:

- Compete in three different gymkhana events.

 Provide video documentation of all three competitions.
- Compete in two different AMHA Medal Classes.

 Provide video/photo documentation and show results of your classes.
- Place 1–3 in any seat equitation class (each discipline counts as one choice). *Provide video/photo documentation and show results of your class.*
- Place 1–3 in any driving class (each discipline counts as one choice). *Provide video/photo documentation and show results of your class.*
- Place 1–3 in any pleasure class (each discipline counts as one choice). *Provide video/photo documentation and show results of your class.*
- Place 1–3 in a showmanship class or leader in amateur in-hand class (each class counts as one choice).

Provide video/photo documentation and show results of your class.

- Compete in a parade class, roadster under saddle or driving or a combined driving class. Provide video/photo documentation and show results of your class.
- Compete in a hunter/jumper class or a trail class (each counts as one choice). Provide video/photo documentation and show results of your class.
- Successfully complete a reining pattern on a Morgan.

 Provide a video of your pattern and copy of the pattern.
- Complete a dressage pattern (each discipline counts as one choice). *Provide a video of your pattern and copy of the pattern.*
- Complete a sanctioned trail ride of 20 miles or more. Sanctioned by NATRC, ECTRA or AERC. Provide paperwork from your trail ride/entry forms/results/etc. Also provide photos/video of your ride.
- Show training progress over time with a young or green horse.

 Document your progress with journals, videos, and photos. Must be a time frame of at least three months.

2: EXPOSURES/EXPERIENCES/INTERNSHIPS

For this phase you must choose four of the following professionals to spend at least eight hours with. In this time, you will learn the tips and tricks of their trade. You must provide a video, photo, and written documentation of your experiences. A written report of at least two pages must be provided for the time spent for each of the professionals you spend time with.

If your equine focus for education is not on this list, please contact Nikki for approval of your idea.

3: TASKS

In this phase, there are three mandatory tasks to complete in addition to three tasks of your choice from the provided list.

The following tasks MUST be completed:

- Hold a position on the AMHA Youth Council, in a local Morgan club or in an FFA or 4-H Club. You must provide documentation, photos and videos of participation.
- Perform a riding or driving demonstration for a group of 15 people or more.

 Provide video/photo documentation along with flyers and advertisements for your event.
- Work as a counselor at a horse camp, work in a therapeutic riding program, or volunteer at a horse rescue.

Provide movie/photo documentation along with signed document from manager at chosen facility stating your contribution.

Please complete three tasks of your choice on the following list:

- Serve on a show committee for a year.

 Provide paperwork (minutes/events/etc.) as well as signed document from committee member.
- Listen at a state house during a motion that effects animals—for or against. *Provide documentation of the motion as well as photos.*
- Win senior division at AMHA approved youth contest local, regional or national. *Provide contest results, photos/video documentation.*
- Build an AMHA Team and lead it for a year.

 Provide photos/videos of your team along with roster and points log.
- Organize a Morgan promotional event.

 Provide photo/video documentation of event along with all advertisement flyers and essay on what the even is about.
- Prepare lesson plans, do lessons for beginner for at least two months.

 Provide the lesson plans, as well as photos/videos of documentation.

4: COMMUNITY SERVICE

AMHA Youth Merit Community Service Hours Log

Amount of Community Service Hours is dependant on which level you are completing.


